God's Shared Characteristics



Introduction

While there are some characteristics of God that are uniquely His, there are other attributes which He desires that we also possess. The intent of this study is to explore those Godly characteristics that He desires us to possess. The very heart of God's plan and purpose for our lives is centered in these qualities taking root in our life. No disciple should leave home without them.

Holiness

There are three dimensions to God's Holiness:

- □ **Perfection** He is without fault or defect
- □ **Purity** He is free from contamination or pollutants
- □ **Separateness** He is distinct and totally separated from His creation

² Above him were seraphs, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. ³ And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory."

When words are ascribed to the character of God in scripture, only the quality of Holiness is thrice repeated. You will not find heavenly beings saying "Merciful, Merciful, Merciful" or "Gracious, Gracious, Gracious" though those things are true. It is the Holiness of God that warrants repeating.

The Hebrew word **qadash** is translated "to sanctify, be holy". So a synonym for the word **holy** is the word **sanctify**



His Righteousness and Justice

Righteousness and Justice go together like hand and glove. His righteousness is the basis upon which all moral law is founded. His justice is the means of determining rewards or punishment based upon His Righteousness

Righteousness and justice are the foundation of your throne; love and faithfulness go before you.

Ps 89:14

To do righteousness and justice is desired by the LORD rather than sacrifice.

Righteousness

Righteousness is simply doing what is right. Sin and righteousness are therefore opposites. God is Himself righteous. He imputes righteousness to those who seek the righteousness of His Son. And he calls each believer to live righteous lives in a world of sin.

For the LORD is righteous; He loves righteousness; the upright will behold His face.

His Justice

Justice is God giving to a person what he or she deserves for their deeds. See how God describes the way that he will judge the earth.

Before the LORD, for He is coming; for He is coming to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness, and the peoples in His faithfulness.

Psalms 96:13

Before the LORD; for He is coming to judge the earth; He will judge the world with righteousness, and the peoples with equity.

Psalms 98:9

- **Equity** means freedom from bias or favoritism.

Therefore the LORD longs to be gracious to you, and therefore He waits on high to have compassion on you. For the LORD is a God of justice; how blessed are all those who long for Him.

His Compassion, Grace and Loving Kindness

When God described Himself to Moses, He could have used words that described His Power, or words that described His blamelessness, words which might strike fear into the heart of Moses. Instead, He said...

⁶... "The LORD, the LORD, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, ⁷ maintaining love to thousands, and forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin. Yet he does not leave the guilty unpunished; he punishes the children and their children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation."

Exodus 34:6-7

His Compassion or Mercy

The Hebrew word *rachuwm* is translated compassion or mercy. Compassion implies a consciousness of another's distress, with a desire to alleviate it. God is merciful. He delights in showing mercy. The place of His dwelling in the tabernacle is called the mercy seat.

¹³Just as a father has compassion on his children, so the LORD has compassion on those who fear Him. ¹⁴For He himself knows our frame; He is mindful that we are but dust.

David, when confronted with his sin concerning Bathsheba, prayed to the God who was gracious, full of loving-kindness and compassion. (Psalms 51:1)

Those who are guilty of sin seek not God's justice but His mercy.



Compare:

Justice is God giving to us what we deserve. **Mercy** is God withholding what we deserve.

Jesus and Mercy

Those who were in need were unashamed to ask Jesus for Mercy:

Meditate

In His parable on forgiveness in Matt 18:23-35, Jesus makes it clear that forgiveness and mercy are bound together. Why is compassion a prerequisite to forgiveness?

His Graciousness

Grace is quite different from mercy. Where **mercy** withholds that which is deserved, **grace** gives something good that is **not** deserved. When used in conjunction with God, grace always means that God gives us undeserved blessing.

And rend your heart and not your garments. "Now return to the LORD your God, for He is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger, abounding in loving-kindness, and relenting of evil.

Joel 2:13

- According to the above verse, circle the phrase that indicates why someone should return to the Lord?
- The word "**rend**" means "to split or tear apart". In this case we are urged to take inward rather than outward action.

⁷In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace, ⁸which He lavished upon us. In all wisdom and insight

His Love

Perhaps no characteristic of God is more well known than His Love. Over and over, the message of the Old and New Testament is that God is Love.

But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners. Christ died for us.

Romans 5:8

In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

I John 4:10

- **Propitiate** means to gain favor or good will. So when the Son is the propitiation, He is the means of gaining favor.

O give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; for His lovingkindness is everlasting.

1 Chronicles 16:34

- Underline the word that describes the duration of God's love

Consider:

The reason for returning is God's grace (he'll give me something good I don't deserve) and His compassion or mercy (He'll withhold the punishment I do deserve)



The Hebrew word for lovingkindness is **checed**. The word combines three thoughts into the one word: strength, steadfastness and love. The English word devotion comes closest to meeting the Hebrew meaning.
